
### **Universiti Malaya's Commitment to Quality Education**

This call to action on SDG 4, as pledged by Universiti Malaya, the oldest public and research university in Malaysia, is reflected in our diverse lifelong learning initiatives coupled with our supportive policy framework.

### **Proportion of Graduates with Teaching Qualification**

In alignment with Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4) — Quality Education, the Universiti Malaya (UM) demonstrates its commitment by preparing qualified graduates to contribute to early childhood and primary education. The consistent proportion of UM graduates with relevant teaching qualifications, reaching a peak of 6.5% in 2022 and sustaining at 5.9% in 2023, underscores UM's dedication to enhancing educational quality and accessibility at foundational levels, ultimately supporting the development of inclusive and equitable education systems.

### **Universiti Malaya Library**

With the growing interest in information, knowledge and scholarly activities, the UM library has transformed its name to Digital Scholarship & Information Commons (DSIC), Established in 1959. DSIC has a total collection of more than one million up-to-date titles. It comprises a Central Library that provides comprehensive library facilities for the entire campus, along with a network of branch and special libraries to meet the specific needs of various faculties. The library is led by the Chief Librarian, supported by a team of professional librarians, support and technical staff.

The five (5) focus areas of DSIC are:

- Enriching the student learning experience
- Advancing research for the public good through research partnership
- Growing as learning organisation that nurtures, enables, and empowers talent
- Creating an equitable environment for education, engagement, and inspiration
- Enhancing strategic partnership and community engagement



#### MicroCredentials@UM


Microcredentials@UM is an initiative launched in 2019 to assist Universiti Malaya educators in designing and publishing high-quality online courses to meet the university's goal of expanding its online course offerings.

Since its launch, UM has successfully received thousands of enrolments via FutureLearn platform from diverse learners across the globe.

A total of over 42 publicly accessible online courses are offered under the Microcredentials@UM initiative, led by the Academic Strategic Planning Department (ASPD) in collaboration with FutureLearn.

#### **SULAM UM**

Service Learning Malaysia - University for Society (SULAM) is an innovative initiative designed to bridge higher education and societal needs by encouraging students to address real-world challenges and improve communities. As defined by the National Service Learning Clearinghouse, service learning integrates meaningful experiences with education, fostering civic responsibility and strengthening communities. This initiative reflects the global shift towards education that not only focuses on academic knowledge but also social impact, a core principle aligned with SDG 4: Quality Education.

SDG 4 emphasises inclusive, equitable quality education and the promotion of lifelong learning opportunities. SULAM actively contributes to this goal by embedding service learning into UM's academic framework, ensuring students gain practical knowledge, develop a deeper understanding of their role in society, and enhance their social consciousness. The Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) Malaysia has also made service learning a requirement for university students, underscoring the importance of holistic education that extends beyond the classroom.

According to Eyler and Giles (1999), service learning is a form of experiential education, where students work through a cycle of action and reflection. As they apply their academic knowledge to solve community problems, they simultaneously reflect on their own growth and understanding, achieving both tangible objectives for the community and deeper personal insights.

At Universiti Malaya, SULAM represents one of the key components in cultivating well-rounded graduates with an entrepreneurial mindset, ready to contribute positively to society. The initiative also exemplifies High Impact Educational Practices (HIEPs), a framework introduced by the Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) in 2016. In line with UM's commitment to SDG 4, SULAM integrates academic rigor with civic engagement, offering students the opportunity to be lifelong learners while actively making a difference.

Universiti Malaya enhances the impact of the SULAM initiative by providing free online educational resources through the SULAM Module, which supports both students and educators in adopting service learning practices. These resources are accessible at SULAM UM, further contributing to the democratisation of education—a key aspect of SDG 4.



### **Museum of Asian Art and Art Gallery**

The Museum of Asian Art boasts a long history, having been built up over a period of almost 50 years. The museum's present home was constructed to accommodate the increasing new acquisition. In June 1980, the new building was established in the scenic area between the Faculty of Economics and the Faculty of Law (currently occupied by the Faculty of Business and Accounting). Within three floors of exhibition space, the museum represents three significant civilisations: Indian, Chinese and Islamic (Malay culture).

The Museum is home to a total of six (6) categories of collections:


- Malaysiana: The Malay collection includes crafts such as basketry, textiles, brass, silver, and wood carvings
- Southeast Asia (Cambodia, Thailand, Laos, Vietnam, Indonesia): The diverse cultures of Southeast Asia are represented through sculptures, textiles, jewellery, ceramics, and terra-cotta works

- India: A collection of Indian stone sculptures, from as early as the Sathavahana period, as well as Jain and Buddhist iconography
- The Persian World and the West Asia (Iran, Iraq and Middle East): This includes Islamic bronzes, miniature paintings, tombstones, and precious stones used for seals
- China: A comprehensive range of Chinese ceramics and porcelain that spans almost the entire history of this art form in China (3,000 years)
- Japan: Ceramics originating from the early Karatsu tradition and Imari/Kakiemon period

In 2023, the Museum of Asian Art and Art Gallery has showcased at least six exhibitions, enhancing educational engagement and cultural appreciation.

Rimba Ilmu Botanic Garden, located in Universiti Malaya, Kuala Lumpur, is a lush green sanctuary designed for education, research, and conservation. Spanning over 80 hectares, it houses diverse plant species native to Malaysia and Southeast Asia, making it a vital ecological hub. Visitors can explore tropical plants, rare herbs, medicinal species, and various ecosystems. Established to promote environmental awareness and preservation, Rimba Ilmu offers a serene escape within the city, ideal for nature lovers, researchers, and students alike.

Rimba Ilmu also serves as an important research site for many scientific studies, such as phytochemistry (investigating the chemical properties of plants, including medicinal uses and anti-bacterial properties), plant growth and structure, and even insect life.

Rimba Ilmu collaborates with various entities, such as the Forest Research Institue of Malaysia (FRIM) and renowned research universities in the country, including Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM), and Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM).

Two prominent features of educational and research resources from Rimba Ilmu include:

Herbarium: one of the most important herbaria in Malaysia, with collection containing over 75,000 accessions. Established in 1960 and registered with the International Association for Plant Taxonomy under the acronym KLU, it is the oldest university herbarium in the country. The emphasis is on Malaysia's native flora, although a good selection of temperate flora has also been assembled through exchange. The Herbarium moved to its current location at Rimba Ilmu in 2000.

Green House (Rumah Hijau): These research facilities are specially built for researchers to conduct scientific studies. There are six such facilities, each housing different research projects by researchers and students, focusing on plants, agriculture, plant physiology, and more.



### Toying With Science - Student Outreach with STEM Inspired Social Innovation

The declining interest in Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics (STEM) among students is a global concern that threatens nations' competitiveness in an ever-changing marketplace. The decreasing enrolment in STEM fields at both high school and university levels is often linked to a lack of excitement and feelings of inferiority toward STEM subjects. In this project, UM volunteers utilises toys to incorporate design thinking, providing excellent learning opportunities for student to see science in action. A team of UM students and lecturers co-developed science-annotated learning modules using toys (in the form of a Science Kit) that serve as teaching aids for Science subjects in lower secondary and primary classes. The kit includes lessons and learning activities related to toys, offering students the opportunity to learn science through an integrated approach. Experiential learning activities were carried out using these modules with participation from young learners, monitored by teachers and volunteers. Six schools, with a total of 11 teachers and 198 pupils, engaged in these activities.

### Interactive Theatre: A New Way for Rural Children to Learn Better

Interactive theatre has been introduced as an innovative educational method aimed at improving learning outcomes among children in rural Malaysia, where access to additional educational resources is limited. Research conducted by Dr. Marlenny Deenerwan from Universiti Malaya focused on using this approach at Sekolah Kebangsaan Pekan, a school in the rural district of Ranau, Sabah, involving 60 lowachieving Level 1 students.

The study sought to transform traditional teaching methods by integrating drama activities such as storytelling, puppet theatre, and readers' theatre, facilitated by professional actors. Findings revealed that these previously "passive" students became active participants, utilising their creativity and critical thinking skills in interactive settings.

The immersive nature of the theatre broke down barriers, allowing children to explore and express themselves, ultimately enhancing their learning experience. Despite initial scepticism from teachers due to a lack of exposure to performing arts, they gradually recognised its potential. The project proposes expanding the model to more schools to refine the methodology and demonstrate its effectiveness to the Ministry of Education for broader implementation. By integrating play into learning, interactive theatre encourages children to learn in a fun and engaging way, helping them realise their academic potential.

### Health is Wealth - Healthy Ageing for Senior Citizens of Petaling Jaya

Malaysia entered an ageing society in 2020 and is expected to become a super-aged community by 2056. According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), an ageing society is that in which seven per cent of the population is 65 years and above. The elderly population in Malaysia is defined as persons aged 60 years and above. In Malaysia, the retirement age is between 56 to 60 years old, while some may opt for early retirement, and others may continue to work actively beyond the retirement age. Both the elderly and their caregivers need to be empowered for better healthcare provision and delivery. Issues related to the elderly are commonly categorised into five areas: health, economic stability, cultural engagement, psychological well-being, and social inclusion. In the recent budget 2023, there was insufficient allocation for agefriendly facilities or infrastructures, as well as tax incentives for caregivers of the elderly.

This program encompasses three initiatives focusing on bio-psycho-social support and financial well-being for the elderly population in Petaling Jaya. In alignment with UM's tagline, "Serving the Nation, Impacting the World", this program aims to assist the community nearest to the campus, Petaling Jaya, specifically, the elderly group.

The program aims to achieved the following outcomes:

- Increased physical activity leading to improvements in self-confidence, joint mobility, and reduced loneliness and social isolation.
- Enhancement of the frailty index, contributing to improved health and wellbeing.
- Improvement in the happiness index, resulting in decreased loneliness, stress, and depression.
- Empowerment of participants to apply mindfulness training and Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) for self-care.
- Training of trainers for CBT and mindfulness, enabling replication within families and other communities by NGOs and stakeholders.
- Enhanced knowledge and self-awareness of financial independence, safety, and expenditure management.

Collaboration with local authorities, healthcare providers, and social organisations will be crucial for the success and sustainability of this program. Regular assessments and feedback from program participants will help to fine-tune the initiative to meet their evolving needs and preferences as they age.

# **Lifelong Learning Access Policy**


Under the Education Pillar of Universiti Malaya Sustainability Policy 2021-2030 (reviewed in September 2023), the University is committed to ensuring that all learners, including remote or long-distance learners, have access to educational resources and support systems needed to acquire the knowledge and skills essential for promoting lifelong learning and sustainable development, including, among others, through education for sustainable development. This includes, but is not limited to, education for sustainable development, human rights, gender equality, the promotion of a culture of peace and nonviolence, global citizenship, and an appreciation of cultural diversity and its contributions to sustainable development. Lifelong Learning in Universiti Malaya caters to both students and staff.

For Universiti Malaya staff, the Staff Empowerment Program (*Program* Pemerkasaan Staf Universiti Malaya) was initiated by the Human Resources Department in Session 2021/2022 academic year for Executive Staff (Grade 41 to 48) from all departments. In 2023, this program has been extended to support the broader staff group (Grade 29 - Operational Staff), aiming to promote lifelong learning and offering opportunities through a degree stacking program for staff to pursue higher degrees. Selected staff enrolled in this program are offered a waiver for course fees for one semester. This initiative is supported by the Human Resources Department in partnership with the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic and International).

The program offers undergraduate and postgraduate courses provided by each Academic Responsibility Centre (PTj) divided into four clusters:

- Administration and Management -Focuses on management and administrative skills to improve organisational efficiency.
- Finance Covers aspects of financial management and accounting to strengthen staff proficiency in this field.
- Technical Courses that emphasise the technical skills required to perform specific tasks.
- Language and Communication Aims to improve language and communication skills, which are essential for effective interaction in the workplace.

Lifelong learning opportunities for UM community and the public are also offered through Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) called Microcredentials@UM via the FutureLearn platform, with a total of 42 courses developed by Universiti Malaya. The Academic Strategic Planning Department (ASPD) reported that in the 2023/2024 academic session, a total of 25,057 participants have registered and completed the courses offered.


